“ Dear Andrea, Lauren and Sean;

Nancy and I grew up across the street from the Dickerson's. We played endless hours of sports, outdoors games, had epic snowballs fights in the winter and bruising chestnut throwing wars in the fall on Linwood Ave or the Village Park. Back in the 60's to late 70's, our little street had 15-20 kids around the same age. We did not lock our doors (house or cars), played "on the street" without parental supervision even when 30-40 Natural Fuel Gas workers exited their parking lot at 4:30PM every weekday and drove up the street interrupting our baseball or football games. Our mothers (never dads) yelled our names from the front porches to come in for dinner or go to bed. It usually took them two or three calls before anyone went home. Anymore than three calls, you would get in trouble and probably not be allowed out the next day. We walked or rode our bikes everywhere in the village even across the busy and dangerous Lake Street. Most mothers did not work so they were around to watch the neighbors kids if necessary. Paul's mother Maxine was the strictest of all the mothers on the street so you had to be on your best behavior when she watch you, ha, ha.

Paul was the kid who you could always trust to do the "right" thing. Paul was smart, caring of others, very polite, studied hard and was a good athlete. Maxine and Tom did a wonderful job raising Paul, Sharon and Tom.
