I have known Rick since I was 5 and he 6 , walking to Annunciation school together. I remember sleeping out in his clubhouse on his side yard or in a tent in “Ricky’s” woods. Played football together in grade school and we spent a lot of time together in his house. In high school our friend Skinny had 2 places to go on cold winter nights when his mother locked him out if he did not get home by 11pm which happened a lot. Rick’s was his 1st choice.

I remember visiting him at Penn State, getting drunk at his frat house, and attending football games. In some ways his college days made me determined to get that education but at Pitt so we could debate , one that lasted a lifetime. Little did I know back then all my kids would end up on his side at PSU.

When We got married he was in our wedding, but in the 70's we went our separate ways but kept in touch, from time to time. In the early 90's we worked in the same building in town and I remember us having a drink after work and talking about our youth, and our work, he was CFO / Tres at his company, and it had gone thru a lot of change in the 80's he talked about how he had to deal with the unions on contracts, dealing in the 80's in China, and I said “you know we owe a lot to those guys we grew up with they made us tough.”

I feel thru all of this tough time, not getting to travel or play golf after such a delayed retirement, he showed me that grit I knew the day we fought for 2 hours on the old “Unie” a wooded hilltop near Rick’s house (he beat the Shit out of me that day) .

I saw the courage in him these last days, that I hope I have when my time comes.

one more quote: If I were to give what I consider the single most useful bit of advice for all of humanity it would be this: Expect

trouble as an inevitable part of life and when it comes, hold your head high, look it squarely in the eye and say "I will be bigger than you. You cannot defeat me Ann Landers. None of us can beat that inevitable death but Rick showed me he was bigger than his cancer.
