First, please accept my sincerest sympathies for your loss. I continued to be in touch with Tom periodically up through this past summer. He had stopped by my house in Indiana Township not too long before his passing. Unfortunately, I was not home at the time. As Tom often did, he left his calling card with a brief note on the back. He said that this would probably be his last visit to see me. I called him that evening and we had the most pleasant conversation catching up on both families. We reminisced a bit, as Tom loved to do and then ended the conversation.

I can honestly say that Tom was like an extended member of the Ryan-McClelland family. Growing up, my grandmother Hilda Ryan, my mother Mary Louise McClelland and I would ride out to the "country" (Wexford) to visit with Lou, Marie, and Tom. Lou and Marie, Tom and John's parents had been good friends of my grandparents when they were young adults (I believe) The grown ups would be in the den chatting away. Tom and the "kids" would sit at the kitchen table having a grand time. During the summer months, Tom would takes us on day trips to Conneaut Lake or Pymatuning Lake to feed the fish. We also went to forts around town always ready to learn something new. Riding Tom's riding lawn mower in the back yard was always a big treat. My mother and grandmother watched the Snaman home move from its original location north on Route 19 to its present location on Warrendale-Banyne Rd. Tom taught me how to drive and made a point to make sure that I could drive safely in the snow and ice. When I became a miniature enthusiast, Tom became interested, too. He was a friend to my grandmother, my mom, and to me for many, many years.
